6	SHRIMP - Fish/River Monitoring Programme	Action	
O	Electro-fishing has received minimal effort and needs to increase in respect of water release trials. Data exchange with the EA has improved but is limited by available resources and, possibly, by different methodologies employed. RF pointed out the need for effective reporting to DEFRA will depend on sound data. GP emphasised that reliable data storage and availability is essential. RF stated that 5years of data from 40 sites are available for the Exe and Fowey rivers.		
	WRT Nutrient Budget Model. SW asked how this model will benefit the programme as much of the data seemed anecdotal and of questionable reliability.		
	ACTION: SCW to check		
	Tagging: A contractor had been appointed for smolt tagging but the timing was wrong. Now, adult trout will be tagged in autumn and smolts next year – NB the March 2015 programme termination!		
	Water Releases from Avon Dam The use of water releases from the dam to assist downstream migration of smolts rather than upstream migration of adult fish is considered to be a more effective use of the available water. The EA, SWW and WRT have met three times to develop a trial protocol for use April/ May but no release was made due to a natural spate. There is still legal confusion about the volume of water that should be released under the terms of the original license.		
	ACTION: KB to issue the agreed water release protocol		
8	SHRImP - Gravel augmentation 600 tons of gravel purchased for the 3 SHRImP rivers and storage arranged. Gravel (granite) is poor quality and needs processing to render suitable for purpose. Peter Downes (U of P) will be involved in tagging gravel at 5 or 6 sites upstream of South Brent. SWW may fund future work on augmentation and monitoring but effect on spawning will be beyond SHRImP's duration.
